## Method of verifying education

## OBJECTIVES

The aim of the course is familiarize the students with phonetic symbols and the rules of phonetic transcription, as well as the rules of English and American pronunciation. The students will exercise recognizing sounds, distinguishing between minimal pairs, recognizing word and sentence accent, as well as perfect the pronunciation of consonants, vowels and diphthongs, and improve pronunciation in terms of intonation, word and sentence stress.

## COURSE CONTENT

- Phoneme/phone/allophone. Narrow and broad phonetic transcription. International Phonetic Alphabet (IPA).
- Regional varieties of English. Rhoticity.
- Unstressed syllable. Word stress.
- Long and short vowels.
- Diphthongs.
- Weak forms and sentence stress.
- Consonant classification. Obstruents and sonorants. Syllabic consonants. Silent consonants.
- Major allophones: glottal stop, voiced alveolar tap, aspirated articulation. Pre-fortis clipping.
- Intonation.
- Sociolinguistic aspects of pronunciation.
- Major challenges in constructing and delivering public speeches in English

## DESCRIPTION OF THE EXPECTED LEARNING RESULTS
